

Shrewsbury

If you are staying in South Shropshire a trip up to Shrewsbury is a must. Spend time in the older Tudor part of the town situated within a large loop of the River Severn. Attractions include Shrewsbury Abbey, Museum and Art Gallery and Castle and most of all the award winning Market



Hall. Pop into the Tourist Information at the Music Hall on Market Street for more information about what is happening.

Ludlow

The bus sets down at the Aldi supermarket, railway station and Upper Galdeford and picks up for Shrewsbury on Corve Street (just below the Compasses Inn).

Head for the historic core; it is located between the medieval St Laurence's church and Ludlow Castle. It still retains a medieval street layout, but descending to the south are two of Ludlow's finest Georgian streets, Mill Street and Broad Street. There's a lively open market most days, plus plenty of cafés and local shops.

Visitor Information is available at the Assembly Rooms in the Market Square.



The whole journey takes approximately 1 hour 15 minutes.

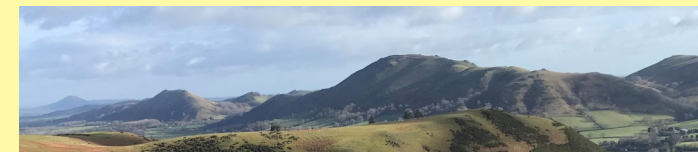
Shrewsbury to Ludlow



The bus ride through South Shropshire links together a number of lovely places to visit, Church Stretton, Shropshire Hills Discovery Centre at Craven Arms and the historic township of Ludlow.



As the bus makes its way through the Shropshire Hills Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty enjoy superb views across to the Wrekin, the Lawley, Caer Caradoc: mystical shaped hills rich in folklore.





Shropshire Hills Discovery Centre, Craven Arms

There's a bus stop just a minute's walk from the Centre (open daily), located in a landmark building with its eye catching curves and grass roof depicting nearby hillforts. There's a superb exhibition, gallery, shop and café and great short walks around the Onny meadows. Look out for the Museum of Lost Content and nearby Stokesay Castle.

Bromfield and Ludlow Farm Shop

The bus also stops near to the Ludlow Farm Shop (open daily) at Bromfield. There is also an inn, café and other retail outlets on site.

Church Stretton

The bus calls at Beaumont Road in the centre of this small town known for its local shops and only a 15 minute walk away from Carding Mill Valley and the National Trust's Pavilion café. If you have time, take a look at the parish church and Rectory Wood which leads up to the Long Mynd; it really is a walkers' paradise.
